

Research and innovation processes vs policies (1)

• R&I processes

- curiosity
- uncertainty
- search and discovery
- constant failures, rejections
- 'creative destruction'

R&I policy

- solutionism & relevance
- plan, design, implement, evaluate
- coordinate, collaborate, co-create
- speed-up the R&I cycle
- steering/guiding R&I processes, markets

Research and innovation processes vs policies (2)

What it means?

- we (researchers) **follow the money** → "of course societal challenges are the most important R&I issues"
- we talk the policy talk → "of course, co-creation, piloting, greater focus on diffusion and innovation etc. are crucial for 'better' R&I outcomes"
- in the lab/office, we do **what we believe** is important → curiosity and excellence driven R has the the most long-term and highest impact on society
- → Researchers are probably much more skeptical about the inclusiveness oriented R&I policy processes and outcomes than they show out
- → Innovation is not the outcome of coordination, consensus, collaboration, cocreation → innovators (and innovative researchers) are selfish, charismatic, individualistic and swim against the common norms, views, consensuses
