1974 Regulation of the EU Council;
Coordination of agricultural
research in scope of the
Common Agricultural Policy

"...the most appropriate way of
developing cooperation is to set up a
Committee consisting of representative
Member States and presided over by a
representative of the Commission which
could usefully help and advise the
Commission in carrying out the tasks which
devolve upon it in the field of the
coordination of research in agriculture"

2005 Revised mandate

Committee moved from

EC DG AGRI to DG RTD

Coordination and collaboration

with KBBE-NET (Knowledge-Based Bio-Economy
Network)

Focus expanded from research
supporting agricultural production
to research supporting a
multifunctional sustainable agriculture,
taking into account
wider environmental and societal issues



# SCAR Background and brief history

- **2011** Evolution into a "New SCAR" Emcompassing the whole bioeconomy including:
  - Forestry
  - Fisheries and aquaculture
  - Food production and processing chain
  - Non-food biomass development for industrial products and processes



#### **Mentors**


Individuals well-experienced with SCAR: current members of the SCAR SG; actively involved in one or more SCAR WGs






