Mr. Ryszard Zarudzki, Undersecretary of State in the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development. Born on July 7, 1959, province Kuyavian-Pomeranian Voivodeship, Bydgoszcz district. Doctor of Agricultural Sciences. In 1987-1997 he was a research worker, assistant at the Department of Animal Production at the University of Technology and Agriculture in Bydgoszcz. In the period 1997-2006, he worked at the Pomeranian Agricultural Advisory Center in Gdańsk - Lipce. Since November 2015, Undersecretary of State in the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, supervising: Department of Direct Payments, Department of Rural Development, Department of Strategy, Analysis and Development and Technical Assistance Office. Since -2016 a member of the Council of the National Center for Research and Development, transfer of knowledge and innovation for agricultural practice. Author or co-author of numerous scientific and popular science papers in the field of agriculture and food economy.
